Course Description: AP European History is designed to challenge students at a level comparable to a college course. The class deals with the social, economic, and political trends in European affairs, from the late Middle-Ages to modern-day. The broad scope of the course makes it necessary for students to do extensive independent reading from a text and from supplemental sources in order to be prepared for in-depth class discussions. To assess individual grasp of the issues and to enrich student experiences, students must write analytical essays on a regular basis and participate in discussions, debates, mock trials and other activities.
