

AP[®] French Language

Syllabus

Course Overview

Course Objectives:

- The goal of this course is to enable students to attain proficiency in reading, writing, listening and speaking French according to national standards and to prepare students for the AP[®] French Language Exam.
- A community outreach project is a required element of this course. Extra-curricular activities such as French club, International day activities, and individual community outreach opportunities will be available for students to acquire points toward this project grade.
- Students will read a complete novel, portions of a popular drama, various poetry, fables, song lyrics, short stories, editorials, and news articles from several francophone authors.
- Grammar reviews will occur daily.
- Written Compositions will be practiced and perfected weekly with students creating original samples based on picture sequences some of which are generated by the AP[®] French workbook of Ladd and Girard. The writing process will include rough drafts, peer editing, first draft (to be edited by teacher), rewriting of the edited first draft, and an oral presentation of the work.
- French is spoken almost exclusively. Each day, students will have an impromptu French dialogue with another student, take part in reading aloud, listening and responding to a grammar lesson. On a weekly basis students will sing a French song, play a game using French board games, recite French poetry and discuss literature in French.

Course Resources:

Primary texts: *Une Fois Pour Toutes*, *AP French; Preparing for the language examination*,; *Image trois*, and *Listening Comprehension Skills for Intermediate and Advanced Students*.

Supplementary texts: *Candide*, *Lisons comme ça!*, *Les Misérables*, *Fables de la Fontaine*,, *French comprehensive Practice and Testing*, *AP French literature anthology*, and a variety of poetry, song, comic strip, editorial and dramatic writings.

Technological resources: Computer lab with internet access for on line practice of French listening, reading, and activities. Classroom tape players for recording and listening to student produced speech and for listening to the audiocassettes that accompany the *AP French; Preparing for the language examination*. CD players and a DVD player for students to listen to professionally produced song, documentary, drama, and video skits. Classroom television linked to online computer, VCR and DVD player for students to view French TV commercials and Movies from

Cassettes, Web based Newscasts and Radio stations, as well as viewing Power Point presentations that students will share with the class.

Course Planner:

This course is designed to accommodate 90 minute classes that meet 5 times per week for one semester consisting of 18 weeks. Students will participate daily in listening, reading, writing and speaking activities. Activities will reinforce grammar rules, new vocabulary, literature reviews and encourage oral response while creating an atmosphere that encourages participation. Each week will include a review of several different grammatical elements as well as a single topic of vocabulary to be used for dialogue participation. Assessments will occur weekly for writing and listening and daily for speaking and reading.

Une fois pour toutes will be completed by each student according to the plan of study encouraged by the authors of the book. Differentiation of instruction will occur through the use of the pretests available at the beginning of each section and each student will show proficiency in each topic before moving on to the next topic. Students will be given weekly assessment opportunities to show competence and fluent usage of reviewed grammar and vocabulary. Further grammar practice will occur based on the students' individual needs and interests. Students will be required to complete activities from 6 of the 10 chapters of *Image trois* once *Une fois pour toutes* has been completed.

There will be approximately three literature units that will coincide with the reviewed grammar and vocabulary units. The literature studies will include one complete novel that is read, discussed and reported upon entirely in French. Another study will include a variety of writing formats such as poetry, short story, fable, song, comics, and historical reference. Lastly, a current events unit will include media sources such as newspaper, magazine, TV, Radio and online resources. All of these literature readings will be completed and discussed entirely in French.

Writing assessments will occur concurrently with the grammar and literature studies. Students will practice the writing process of rough drafts, peer edits, first drafts, teacher edits, final drafts and presentation of their writings in response to the literature in French. Picture or word prompted writings will be practiced weekly by students in preparation for the AP[®] French Language Exam.

Speaking in and listening to French will be practiced daily through lecture, partner activities and small group learning sessions, as well as whole class games, and songs. Individual listening comprehension assessments will be conducted regularly by asking students to recall in French various recent current editorials they will be assigned to listen to via online news broadcasts. Speaking assessments will be conducted alternatively live with the teacher and recorded onto tape cassette by the student. Students will be asked to self assess their own strengths and weaknesses in their speech patterns as well as meet with the teacher to attain positive critical feedback.
