

## **Dual Enrollment/Credit**

There are many benefits to pursuing college coursework before you graduate from high school:

- Enriches the course opportunities for outstanding secondary school students
- Shortens the time to attain a college degree or certificate (time = money!)
- Saves students and parents money, as these courses are offered at an extremely discounted rate of only \$100/credit
- Grades earned in these courses will become part of a student's college transcript
- Classes are taught by Pocono Mountain School District teachers. Advanced Placement Courses and Statistics are aligned with Keystone College courses and approved for college credit.
- These courses, because they are taught by PMSD teachers, will count in class rank and GPA. Students will also be awarded college credit for the course through Keystone College.
