



Build-a-Panther Event






Kindergarten News




Kindergarten's 100 Days of Learning Celebration




Why is winter so long?

So much good stuff to learn about!













First Graders & Dental Hygiene Month




TEC Cares

Fourth Grades Happenings



TEC's 5th graders have been studying Native American groups in Social Studies.


As a culminating activity for the Eastern Woodlands group, the classes weaved their own wampum belt. The wampum belt was used in the Eastern Woodland group to honor a marriage, to comfort someone on the death of a loved one, as an invitation to peaceful talks, or to signify an important event. They were made using polished seashells. We used a shoebox, colored ditalini noodles, string, and a needle. They did a great job!





6th Grade - Nile River Projects

The 6th grade Social Studies students recently finished a unit of study on the Nile River as a part of our education on Ancient Egypt. Students researched, analyzed, and produced a Nile River project file folder. The folders contain a detailed map of the Nile, facts about the Nile, a paragraph describing how the Ancient Egyptians used the Nile, pictures with captions of how they used papyrus from the Nile River, words, and phrases about the Nile. Last but not least - Did You know? Interesting facts about the Nile. For example, "Did you know that there are over 300 species of birds that live along the Nile?" This is just an example of one of the many cool facts that our 6th grade students learned while completing this project!

RESTORATIVE CIRCLES

Restorative Circles allow us to bring students together to address one time incidents or ongoing problems as deemed appropriate. In order for a circle to be facilitated to solve the problem all parties must be agreeable to use this method to solve the problem. Each student is asked if they would like to get together to discuss and solve the problem. The purpose of the circle is to allow all parties to be heard from their perspective. The circle is run by at least one principal, one counselor and all parties involved including the child(ren). We have done circles with parents, bus drivers, other administrators, teachers, substitute teachers and monitors. When we are in a circle the following questions are asked; What happened?, What were you thinking at the time?, What have you thought about since?, Who has been affected by what you have done? In what way?, What do you think you need to do to make things right? Each individual has an opportunity to answer these questions and they may answer or pass. After the questions are asked the dialogue continues as deemed appropriate. The goal is for everyone to walk away feeling heard and able to go on being comfortable.

What Is SAP?

A SAP team made up of school and agency staff is available to help you access school and community services for your child. In Pennsylvania, every school district is required to have a plan for identifying and assisting students who experience barriers to learning. The TEC SAP team will help you find services and assistance within the school, and if needed, in the community. We do not diagnose, treat, or refer your child for treatment. We will provide you with information and you make the choice that best fit your needs and wishes. As the parent/guardian you are an important part of the team. The SAP team information is completely confidential and the team will respect you and your child's privacy at all times. March is National Caffeine Awareness Month



National Caffeine Awareness Month is an annual event held in March that draws attention to the risk associated with caffeine addiction and caffeine withdrawal syndrome, a disorder recognized by the psychiatric community. At 200 mg of caffeine, you can experience irritability, restlessness, tension, insomnia, excitement, and gastrointestinal disturbance. If you consume more than 1 gram (1000 mg), you can receive irregular heartbeats, panic and anxiety disorders, muscle twitching, incoherent speech, excessive urination, flushed skin, and depression. And, believe it or not, when you ingest more than 5 grams, the results can be fatal.

Are You Caffeine Dependent? Caffeine Quiz: Ask Yourself This...

Do you drink more than four cups of coffee a day?

Do you drink several cans of caffeinated soft drinks or several cups of tea a day?

Do you often find yourself irritable, depressed or disoriented after drinking caffeinated beverages?

When you don't drink caffeine do you find yourself experiencing headaches, drowsiness, or insomnia?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, you may be caffeine dependent according to the Caffeine Awareness $\sqrt[p]{Association}$.

What Does Caffeine Do To Our Bodies?

When caffeine enters your body, your pupils dilate, your heart beats faster, your muscles tighten and your blood vessels in your extremities constrict. Caffeine consumption anytime during the day is very likely to disrupt your nighttime sleeping patterns. Caffeine affects the ability of nerves in your brain to take in a chemical called adenosine, which causes sleepiness. Caffeine-drinkers are therefore less likely to sleep deeply and well than those who abstain.

Caffeine has a half-life of about six-hours. That means that if your 4 o'clock cup of coffee contains 200 mg of caffeine, by 10 o'clock that night, there will still be 100 mg of caffeine in your body, preventing you from falling into a deep and restful sleep.

With more than 500 new energy drinks launched each year, caffeine has become the most widely used drug in the world.

Hot Tips For Caffeine Awareness Month:

- Look at what you consume caffeine is often a hidden ingredient in some of our favorite foods.
- Be aware of how much caffeine you are consuming in a day.
- If you find yourself physically dependent on caffeine, look at why you consume certain caffeinated drinks. Is it the flavor, the social aspect, the energy boost, or is it out of thirst or boredom? The answer will help you to determine if there is a healthier way to fill that need.


















TEC Chorus and Band Spring Concert Information

Because we want to improve our students' basic Math facts and skills, we are going to utilize Splash Math for Kindergarten and First in Math for Grades 1 through 6.


We will have a weekly Math classroom winner which will be announced each Friday in March (March & 4, March 11, March 18, and March 25, 2022).
